1 Term 1.1	<b>Building Bricks</b> Intermediate	<p>Year 8 Music is focused on building on the foundation skills taught during Year 7, with the emphasis on introducing more intermediate level skills that enhance and empower a child’s ability to create, perform and evaluate Music through multiple music styles and conventions. 	<p>and Bass Line Musical Patterns.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understand how the <b>Bass Clef</b> is used as a form of musical notation.</li> <li>• <b>Identify musical instruments and voices</b> which use the Bass Clef.</li> <li>• Know and understand the <b>construction of commonly used Bass Line Patterns</b>, using these when performing and creating music.</li> <li>• Understand the importance of a <b>Bass Line in terms of texture</b> and harmony within a song or piece of music.</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>BASS RIFFS</b> – used in Rock, Rap, Hip Hop and Pop songs, bass riffs are short, repeated, and catchy bass line patterns that ‘fit’ with the notes in the chord, but also use other ‘EXTRA’ notes (PASSING NOTES) to make them more memorable.</li> <li>• <b>WALKING BASS</b> – used in Jazz, Blues, Rhythm, and Blues, and Rock’n’roll, a walking bass line features a note on every beat.
